This term we're trying something new and giving a space to showcase some of the amazing staff across our schools. This term: Ms. Bowler!



Hi Ms. Bowler! What is it that you do in the Trust?

Hi, I'm Ms. Bowler, and I am the Trust Inclusion Manger, my role is to look at inclusion and alternative provision for vulnerable students in the Trust, in addition to managing Kings' alternative on site provision – Aspire.

So what made you choose this particular career?

My biggest passion is to make a difference to students and their prospects when they leave education, to see them turn things around and put them back on an even keel. I started my journey after university working in Mental health which I found fascinating. This lead me to work in alternative provisions in secondary schools and to see how they functioned and the students and families that needed support. I then set up my own provision and ran a PRU.

I have also made great contacts that I can now use ... guest speakers, enriching experiences, and qualifications students can be accredited for. This exciting opportunity has allowed me to work across all schools in the Trust to establish a continuum of support to ensure that all students needs are met and that we can offer an "alterative" curriculum for them. I also feel it will bring all schools together and use every skill and experience within staff which we have within the Trust.

What's been a particular highlight of what you do?

One of my biggest highlights was seeing a student who came from a difficult background succeed. We supported him in achieving 5 GCSE'S and then going on to college to study an apprenticeship. He's now is a designer for Vauxhall, has bought a house and just had his first child. A real success story!

What are your goals for your role? What do you hope to do?

My goal for this role would be to branch out with Aspire and create a whole Trust provision that all schools in the Trust can access. This would involve a bigger space and provision for life skills, cooking, and practical skills so students can gain qualifications and access to onsite mental health support.

That's brilliant! Finally, how are you finding working from home right now?

I do feel that this time has been a blessing in disguise as I have managed to get SO much done (as I'm sure many staff can relate!) Being motivated can be difficult some days, but zoom calls with my team and social distancing meetings have been a great way to bounce ideas and stay positive. I do miss the students though!
