Dentistry BDS

The Dental School at Queen's has been responsible for delivering dental education in Northern Ireland since 1920. The 5-year curriculum has been designed to ensure our graduates have the knowledge, skills and attributes to work effectively and successfully in the dental profession.

- Students will have the opportunity to undertake clinical placements from year 1 of the course. During their course students will gain experience in a range of clinical settings to help develop their skills and career opportunities.
- Students who successfully complete the BDS programme can apply for full registration with the GDC which allows the registrant to practise as a dentist in the UK if the student fulfils the UK government's residency requirements.

Job / industry of the Term

Every term we will focus on a job or industry that will help you find more about the huge variety of jobs that are available in the UK.

Music Therapist

Music therapists use music and sound to help improve people's emotional well-being, relieve stress and build confidence.

Day-to-day tasks

As a music therapist you could:

- meet with clients of all ages, families and other professionals
- assess your client's needs, plan therapy goals and prepare for sessions
- use a variety of musical styles and instruments in client-led, group or individual therapy sessions
- monitor progress and have regular sessions with a senior music therapist
- write reports, make recommendations and keep confidential records
- clean and maintain instruments and order supplies

Working environment

You could work in a therapy clinic, in a prison, in an NHS or private hospital or at a school.

Your working environment may be emotionally demanding.

Skills and knowledge

You'll need:

- counselling skills including active listening and a non-judgemental approach
- knowledge of psychology
- knowledge of the fine arts
- sensitivity and understanding
- the ability to work well with others
- patience and the ability to remain calm in stressful situations
- to be flexible and open to change
- the ability to understand people's reactions
- to be able to carry out basic tasks on a computer or hand-held device

<p>You'll need to do an approved postgraduate course in music therapy and then register with the Health and Care Professions Council (HCPC).</p> <p>To get on a postgraduate course in music therapy, you'll usually need a degree in music.</p> <p>However, you might be accepted if you have an education or psychology degree, and you have a high level of music skill.</p> <p>To apply for a postgraduate course, you'll need 1 or 2 years of paid or voluntary work experience in a health, education or social care setting.</p>	<p>You could do an Arts Therapists Level 7 Degree Apprenticeship.</p> <p>You'll usually need a qualification and experience in art, drama or music to apply.</p> <p>Entry requirements</p>

Employability Skill of the Term

Most employers look for certain skills and qualities in job candidates in addition to academic qualifications. Known as employability skills, these skills may not be job-specific, but they play an important role in improving your performance and value in the workplace.

Employers have high regard for employability skills because they are much harder to teach than job-specific skills. Some employable qualities come naturally, while others can be acquired through education, work, or daily practice. You may

already have some of the key employment skills, but you can work to improve those skills and develop new ones. In each edition of Employability Matters we will explore the employability skills that employers look for.

Confidence

Confidence is defined as “a feeling or belief that you can do something well, or succeed at something.”

Confidence is an important employability skill. It can increase job security by making workers more adaptable, flexible, and problem-solving oriented. Confidence allows individuals to apply their knowledge in new situations, which is crucial in the workplace.
